

Dear Bethany Members and Friends,



To bookend Lent this year our services included the famous Prayer of Saint Francis. It begins, "Lord, make me an instrument of your peace." Such a line could be a prayer on its own, as the prayer is asking God to use the speaker's body, mind and spirit to create peace in her/his family, community and in the world. The prayer ends with a realization: "it is in dying to self that we are born to eternal life." The prayer realizes that the more s/he trusts God to work through his/her life the more the "little self" disappears.

The "little self" is how we would define ourselves on a census, our likes/dislikes or the personality we've created. We couldn't survive without a little self, but it can also get in our way and drag us down with shoulds/stress/comparisons. St. Francis suggests that the more we let the Christ light shine in us, the more we realize eternal life – the life of total connection to God – that we can experience in the here and now.

As we celebrate the season of Easter, we do so trusting that Christ is risen (he is risen indeed!) and provides a way to connect us to God through life and death. You may remember our Epistle Reading from Palm Sunday (of course you do!!) where Paul encourages the Philippians, "Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus..." (Phil. 2:5). Instead of filling your mind with the concerns of the little self (worries, competition, greed), fill your mind (or your being) with the risen Christ.

Some people set a timer once a day to bring awareness to their thinking and then take a moment to "empty themselves" (Phil. 2:7) – just for a moment – and allow Christ to fill their being – just for a moment. You may discover that your eternal self desires more and more of this communion time, and your little self grows quieter in their judgments and demands. You may discover that you become an instrument of peace.

My little self is getting super excited for an upcoming family vacation April 7-14. The kids, the grandmas, Ben and I are going to attempt a Disney cruise out of Galveston, TX that stops at two ports in Mexico. Right before that we are going to don our special glasses to be in the central pathway of the Total Eclipse in Kerrville, TX. Pastor Vicki and Pastor Andrea will be leading worship while I am away, and I am so grateful for their willingness, faithfulness and skill.

One final note of feedback – Bethany is about 15% short of meeting our budget as you will notice in the figures further on in the newsletter.

May this Easter season bring the risen Christ deeper into your life and may God bless you to be an instrument of peace,





- II. The meeting was opened with a prayer by Pastor Lisa.

- IV. Minutes from the January 17th meeting were approved.

- V. Old Business
 - a. 2024 Contingency Growth Fund- further discussion on a greater sustainability plan for Bethany.

Carol Bean has shared numerous ideas with Pastor Lisa regarding growing the ministry at Bethany and sustainability plans. Upcoming rummage sale, May 3 & 4, is being planned. Proceeds from the sale will be used to send students to Camp Hiawatha on June 30-July 2. Ages: grades K-4. April 11th Pr. Andrea Bonneville D'Naples from Hiawatha will be our Camp Sunday speaker. Any money raised from the sale over the camp fees will be put into the Contingency Fund.

 - b. Custodian Review- previous custodian was let go as the job wasn't a good fit at this time. We will seek a cleaner from within our congregation.

 - c. Confirmation Guidelines Approval- tabled from January. Pastor Lisa has created updated confirmation guidelines. The guideline will be sent to families with confirmation-age students and

placed in the monthly newsletter. The guidelines will be viewed as a starting point and will be amended as the need arises.

- VI. New Business
 - a. Lights in the fireside room- two lights for placement beside the reading chairs in the fireside room were approved.

 - b. Online worship offerings- there are members that would like to worship via online format. A person to run the recording device is needed to continue this practice. A recommendation to explore purchasing hardware that will take care of the recording. Jody will check with Ara Anderson on possible options available.

 - c. Pollinator Garden 5 Year Plan- Phil has been in contact with Jeff Poenix and a plan has been created. Funds will be placed in a pollinator fund for future maintenance costs.
- VII. Financial Statement- the financial statement was provided by Jen Drotts and current balances were reviewed.
- VIII. Next meeting date- **Wednesday, March 20th, at 4:15 p.m.**
- IX. A motion was made to close meeting.
